Today’s Gospel: Mk 1:29-39

On leaving the synagogue Jesus entered the house of Simon and Andrew with James and John. Simon’s mother-in-law lay sick with a fever. They immediately told him about her. He approached, grasped her hand, and helped her up. Then the fever left her and she waited on them. When it was evening, after sunset, they brought to him all who were ill or possessed by demons. The whole town was gathered at the door. He cured many who were sick with various diseases, and he drove out many demons, not permitting them to speak because they knew him. Rising very early before dawn, he left and went off to a deserted place, where he prayed. Simon and those who were with him pursued him and on finding him said, “Everyone is looking for you.” He told them, “Let us go on to the nearby villages that I may preach there also. For this purpose have I come.” So he went into their synagogues, preaching and driving out demons throughout the whole of Galilee.

In light of the continuing health concerns caused by COVID-19, the Office of Sacred Worship would like to call your attention to the following liturgical instructions

World Day of the Sick (February 11)

It is a tradition in many parishes to celebrate an annual anointing of the sick on February 11, or on the immediately preceding or following weekend.

As noted in the archdiocesan directives and mandates: Anyone over 60 years old and those with underlying health complications are encouraged to participate in Masses via livestream only.

Since those to be anointed should avoid associating with others outside of their “bubble,” the Office of Sacred Worship is instructing priests to arrange for in-home anointings this year. Of course, all necessary precautions and guidelines for anointing of the sick are to be followed, e.g., wearing of masks, use of hand sanitizer, no direct laying on of hands, application of Oil of the Sick using a cotton ball, etc.


ASH WEDNESDAY: Distribution of Ashes in Time of Pandemic

The Priest says the prayer for blessing the ashes. He sprinkles the ashes with holy water, without saying anything. Then he addresses all those present and only once says the formula as it appears in the Roman Missal, applying it to all in general: “Repent, and believe in the Gospel,” or “Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return.”

The Priest then cleanses his hands, puts on a face mask and distributes the ashes to those who come to him or, if appropriate, he goes to those who are standing in their places. The Priest takes the ashes and sprinkles them on the head of each one without saying anything.
