### Holy Father’s Intention for March : Sacrament of Reconciliation

Let us pray that we may experience the sacrament of reconciliation with renewed depth, to taste the infinite mercy of God.

### From the Congregation for Divine Worship and the Discipline of the Sacraments

In light of the continuing health concerns caused by COVID-19, the Office of Sacred Worship would like to call your attention to the following liturgical instructions

### From the Office of Sacred Worship:

**ARCHDIOCESAN LENTEN REGULATIONS** “For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him might not perish but might have eternal life. For God did not send his Son into the world to condemn the world, but that the world might be saved through him.” (John 3:16-17)

The Church has always helped us fulfill these words of Jesus by prescribing very definite penance for all Catholics, so that we too might have Eternal life. Accordingly, the Pope and the American Bishops have outlined obligatory fast and abstinence as follows:

**Ash Wednesday (February 17, 2021), all Fridays of Lent and Good Friday (April 2, 2021) are days of abstinence (refraining from meat) for all Catholics from age 14 onwards.** On these two days, fast, as well as abstinence, is also obligatory for those from the ages of 18-59. Abstinence means refraining from meat. Fast means one full meal a day, with two smaller meals and nothing between meals (liquids are permitted). No Catholic will lightly excuse himself or herself from this obligation. We should strive to make all days of Lent a time of prayer and penance. Following are several resources that can aid in finding different forms of prayer and penance.

### Lenten Regulations: Solemnity of Saint Joseph, Spouse of the Blessed Virgin Mary, Friday, March 19, 2021.

Under Canon 1251: Abstinence from meat, or from some other food as determined by the Episcopal Conference, is to be observed on all Fridays, unless a solemnity should fall on a Friday. Abstinence and fasting are to be observed on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday.

This year, the Solemnity of Saint Joseph falls on a Friday during Lent. Therefore, per the guidelines of this Canon, one would not be obliged to abstain from meat on Friday, March 19, 2021 of this year.
